

PHILADELPHIA EXTERIOR HANGING LANTERN SMALL

SCOFIELD LIGHTING COLLECTION

An eight sided tapered copper and glass lantern with decorative chimney. Ben Franklin's early experience in his father's soap and candle shop led to his invention of a two wick tube that greatly increased the power of lantern light in 1751. Based on street lanterns that lit Philadelphia. Late 18th - early 19th century. Designed and manufactured by Scofield Lighting.
